- **Fundraising & Advocacy** – Participating in campaigns, cultivating donors, and championing SARC's work.
- **Executive Leadership** – Supporting and evaluating SARC's Executive Director.
- **Governance & Mentorship** – Attending monthly board meetings, serving on at least one board committee, and mentoring new members.

Who We're Looking For

We welcome applicants from all backgrounds and especially encourage those from historically underrepresented communities to apply. Ideal candidates bring:

- Passion for survivor-centered, trauma-informed, and anti-oppression work
- Experience or enthusiasm in nonprofit leadership, finance, law, mental health, HR, health care, development, fundraising, marketing, or social justice, and more!
- Commitment to a working board (8–10 hours/month for a 2-year term)
- Willingness to fundraise, network, and raise awareness

Previous board experience is a plus but not required.

- Two-year term (renewable)
